Auction Guidelines

Silent Auction

The Silent Auction opens at 6:30 for viewing / 7:00 for bidding. The minimum bid and minimum raise for each item is written on the bid sheet by the item. To be valid, bids must comply with these minimums and be legible.

To place a bid, sign your name legibly with your bid amount on the bid sheet. Doing so constitutes a legal contract to purchase that silent auction item at the price you stated if your bid is the winning bid. The last (highest) valid bid entered prior to the section closing will be the winning bid. A maximum guaranteed bid (*Win it Now!*) is stated on each bid sheet. By signing your name and bid number in this box, the bidding closes. The item is yours.

The Auction Committee reserves the right to withdraw any item at any time without notice before the actual sale. In the event of a dispute, the Auction Committee shall act as final authority in determining the winning bid.

Live Auction

Live Auction bidding will begin at 8:00 pm. The Live Auction will continue until all items are sold. If a group is bidding on one item, please designate one person to place your combined bid. Auction items will be awarded to one purchaser only. A bid acknowledged by the auctioneer is a legal contract to purchase the item.

Chance Auction

Tickets for the chance auction are sold by the sheet: 26 tickets (one sheet) for \$15; 52 tickets (two sheets) for \$20; and each additional sheet of 26 for \$10. You may bid on the items on the Chance tables by placing a ticket in the container labeled with the same number as the item you want to win. At the conclusion of the bidding, a winning ticket is drawn from the tickets in each container.

Payment

All items must be paid for by the end of the evening. For your convenience, we gladly accept both checks & cash. A 50% payment will be accepted to hold your more expensive selections. The balance is due within 30 days. Please make arrangements for those with Kathleen Hartnett during checkout.

Pick-Up

Once the table closes, the bids will be recorded by the table monitors. If you are the winner, the table monitor will award you a sticker for your "Items Won" sheet. You may then pay for your items at the cashier and return to the table to retrieve your items.

It is the responsibility of the purchaser to locate and remove his/her winning item(s) by the end of the auction. Winners of services are responsible for contacting the donor in order to receive the services offered.

Auction Events Cancellation Guidelines

Event hosts will personally contact participants prior to their event to confirm attendance.

If a guest, after signing up and paying, cannot make an event on the stated date, it is the guest's loss. The host is under no obligation to make up the event for that guest.

If the host needs to cancel, for any reason (i.e., illness, inclement weather, etc.), the host will reschedule the event. If this is not possible, or it is not possible to reschedule it for a time when all guests can attend, those who cannot attend may request a refund from the UUCSJS Treasurer.







Rev. James Reeb, a white Unitarian minister working in a poor black neighborhood in Boston, was one of the many who heeded Dr. King's call for clergy to join him in Selma for the march to Montgomery. Reeb, 38, was a father of four and wholly committed to the cause of civil rights. While in Selma, he and two other white ministers left a diner and were accosted by a trio of white men. Reeb was beaten with a club and slipped into a coma, dying the following day.

Reeb's death, along with the murders of Jimmie Lee Jackson and Viola Liuzzo, brought such intense light to the darkness of violence and hatred in the South that on the evening of Reeb's memorial service, President Johnson made a special plea to Congress to move on the Voting Rights Act. The act was passed later that summer.





619 Nature Photography Workshops

This series of five workshops is for those who wish to learn and understand the technical and artistic aspects of photography. Each workshop will be 2 hours long. You can take all five, or if you already have prior knowledge, can take any advanced workshop. Mike Hannisian taught post-secondary English and secondary math, was a civil trial attorney, and ran a non-profit land trust. Nature Photography Workshops

Workshop 1: This session will be equally applicable to both film and digital cameras and their users, and will be based on the premise that you have no knowledge significant prior photography. It is especially intended for those of you who have received cameras for the holidays, but will also be helpful for those who already have cameras but are not fully comfortable with them. As such, it is important that the instruction manual be brought to each meeting. (If you do not have one, almost all can be downloaded from your company's website.) The topics covered will include shooting modes, RAW vs JPEG. white balance, sharpness, exposure, stops, ISO, aperture/f-stops, shutter speed, depth of field, and shooting techniques. (January 4, 2020)

Workshop 2: This session will address composing your images. A camera allows you to show the world a portion of what we all can see. As such, this means that you have to decide what to include in your images and, of equal importance, what to exclude. This is called composition and is the visual equivalent of editing a written work. The topics covered will include the role of light in photography, the Rule of Thirds, horizontal vs vertical formats, lines, color, shape, depth of field, and creating dynamic images. It will also include a look at ancillary equipment such as external flash units, reflectors, and filters. (Saturday to be arranged by agreement)

Workshop 3: This session will be an introduction to processing software (*i.e.*: Photoshop). Topics will include downloading your images, accessing them in Photoshop, editing your images, preparing your images in Adobe Camera Raw, processing your images using various preset actions, and storing your images. (Saturday to be arranged by agreement)

Workshop 4: This session will cover photographing larger subjects such as birds, mammals, and scenery. The topics covered will include selection and use of equipment, the limitations and advantages of equipment (size matters, but not as much as technique), framing your images, field technique, the use of tripods and monopods, and in-field composition. (Saturday to be arranged by agreement)

Workshop 5: This session will cover photographing smaller subjects such as butterflies, dragonflies, damselflies, other insects, reptiles and amphibians, and flowers and plants. As with the Workshop 4 session, the topics covered will include selection and use of equipment, the limitations and advantages of equipment, framing your images, field technique, the use of tripods and monopods, and in-field composition. (Saturday to be arranged *by agreement)*
