Some plants listed below may not be available due to loss during the growing season; also, quantities may be limited for some species.

Plants will be available on a first come, first served basis. If your order cannot be filled, a full refund will be made.

All native plants are genetically adapted for our area and provide food in the form of nuts, seeds, berries, fruits, leaves, pollen, and nectar that best meet the needs of butterflies and other pollinators, as well as hummingbirds and other birds and wildlife.

(A) TREES

Native trees are the keystone species in any functioning backyard ecosystem. When we think of planting a tree, however, we tend to think of "specimen" trees — a single tree surrounded by lawn. You can maximize environmental impact by planting groupings of trees with an understory of smaller trees and shrubs in tree/shrub islands, on edges, or along property borders.

Mid-sized tree, simple, 6" lustrous dark green leaves, 1½" round, pale-orange berries turn ripe in late fall, wildlife favorite, host plant for luna moths, 30-60'				
Eastern red cedar <i>Juniperus virginiana</i>	Bd, MHP, BfHP, WL	2'	\$13 (3 for \$36)	\$
Evergreen, provides essential early spring nesting sites & year-round shelter, abundant berry-like cones essential to migrant & winter birds, dioecious. A must-have! 40-50'				
Tuliptree <i>Liriodendron tulipifera</i>	Bd, MHP, BfHP, WL, Po	18-24"	\$22	\$
Unusual-shaped, lobed leaves turn yellow in fall, 1½-2" yellow flowers resemble tulips, grows fast, straight & tall (without lower branches), HP for tiger swallowtail				
Sweetbay magnolia <i>Magnolia virginiana</i>	Bd, MHP, BfHP, WL, Po	3-4'	\$22	\$
Small, slender understory tree, 2-3" showy, aromatic flowers, dark green leaves whitish beneath, unusual upright "cone" of red fruit, 10-30'				
Black gum - tupelo <i>Nyssa sylvatica</i>	Bd, MHP, WL, Po	3-4'	\$22	\$
Nectar-rich flowers in May (think: tupelo honey), bluish-black fruits prized by birds, shiny, dark green leaves begin turning scarlet in August, 30-50'

Our most common pine, grows in wet or dry soil, provides food, shelter & nest sites for 35+ species of birds, dark reddish-brown bark, 40-60'

Medium-sized tree, unusual leaves entire, 1-, 2- and 3-lobed on same tree, yellow flowers in spring, peach fall color, dark blue fruit sought after by birds, 40-50'				

➤ **Oaks are "quintessential" wildlife plants supporting 513 native species of lepidoptera (moth, butterfly & skipper).** These protein-rich caterpillars are a critical food source for our nesting birds. Oaks are also an important food source for other native wildlife including 29 species of birds that feed on oak acorns. *Three oak trees are offered below.*

Scarlet oak <i>Quercus coccinea</i>	Bd, MHP, WL, Po	3-4'	\$22	\$
3-7" long, lobed leaves with deep sinuses, leaves open bright red in spring, dark green in summer, scarlet in fall, acorns a choice wildlife food, does well in sandy soil

Leaves 5-9" long with 5-9 rounded lobes, whitish-gray bark, very long-lived tree, acorns prized by birds & wildlife, BfHP for white-m hairstreak & others				
Chestnut oak <i>Quercus prinus</i>	Bd, MHP, BfHP, WL, Po	3-4'	\$22	\$
Yellow catkins in spring, light green 4-8" leaves turn orange-yellow in fall, large, sweet, acorns produced yearly, favorite wildlife food, grows in dry, infertile soil				

(B) SHRUBS

Plant shrubs in groups of three for best impact. Perfect in the shade of trees, on the edges of shrub/tree borders, as foundation plantings, and as hedges. Plant shrubs near bird feeders & bird baths to provide cover from predators.

Small, much sought-after shrub, showy white flowers, attractive to butterflies, does well in poor, dry soils, HP for summer azure, grows slowly to 2-3'				
Buttonbush <i>Cephalanthus occidentalis</i>	Bd, MHP, Bf, BfHP, Po	18-24"	\$13	\$
White flowers in round ball-like heads, blooms in mid-summer, medium size, prefers a moist site, perfect near a drain spout, terrific Bf nectar source! 3-8'

Multiple stems green to reddish brown, white flowers in clusters, bluish fruit sought after by birds, provides good nesting habitat, 6-10'				
Red-twig dogwood <i>Cornus sericea</i>	2-3'	\$13		\$
Small shrub, white flowers in upright flat-topped clusters late May-mid-July, white berries, brilliant red stems - a knockout in all seasons, 3-8'				
Hazelnut <i>Corylus americana</i>	3-4'	\$22		\$
Lovely, multi-stemmed shrub, dark green simple leaves turn yellow in fall, sweet brown nut a wildlife favorite, perfect for a shaded edge, 8-12'				
Witch hazel <i>Hamamelis virginiana</i>	18-24"	\$13		\$
Fragrant, yellow strap-shaped flowers bloom November-December (!) then turn red in January, roundish 3-5" leaves turn bright yellow in the fall, 10-15'				
Inkberry holly <i>Ilex glabra</i>	12-18"	\$13 (3 for \$36)		\$
Shiny, small, deep-green leaves provide shelter for birds year-round, thorn-free and evergreen, small white flowers, black berries persist into winter, dioecious, 3-6'				
Smooth winterberry holly <i>Ilex laevigata</i>	2-3'	\$13 (3 for \$36)		\$
Medium size, deciduous, multi-stemmed shrub, birds feed on bright red berries clustered on twigs and persist into winter, dioecious, 5-9'				
Spicebush <i>Lindera benzoin</i>	3-4'	\$22		\$
Broad-leaved understory shrub, bright yellow flowers in early spring, yellow fall foliage, scarlet fruit, preferred host plant for spicebush swallowtail, 6-10'				
Northern bayberry <i>Myrica pennsylvanica</i>	18-24"	\$17 (3 for \$48)		\$
Bushy, nitrogen-fixing fragrant shrub, waxy berries a very important food source for winter birds, semi-evergreen, salt tolerant, dioecious, 4-6'				
Elderberry <i>Sambucus canadensis</i>	2-3'	\$13		\$
Large, 6-8" wide, clusters of white flowers, followed by dark blue berries prized by 40+ bird species & other wildlife, fast-growing, sun or part shade, 6-12'				
Highbush blueberry <i>Vaccinium corymbosum</i>	2-3'	\$13		\$
Attractive bell-shaped flowers produce abundant edible berries, scarlet fall foliage & red winter stem color, a winner! BfHP for lovely spring azure, salt-tolerant, 4-8'				
Arrowwood viburnum <i>Viburnum dentatum</i>	18-24"	\$17		\$
Rounded, opposite, toothed, deep-green leaves turn dark bronze to red, showy white flowers in upright clusters, dark blue fruits, salt-tolerant, 5-10'				

(C) PERENNIALS

Perennial flowers and groundcovers provide pollen, nectar, or leaf food for butterflies, moths, other native insects, and hummingbirds. Several listed below are also essential butterfly host plants. Much-sought-after groundcovers are ideal for naturalizing around shrub and tree plantings. Plant perennials in groups of 3 to maximize environmental value.
