Native trees are the keystone species in any functioning backyard ecosystem.

When we think of planting a tree, we tend to think of "specimen" trees—a single tree surrounded by lawn. However, you can maximize environmental impact by planting groupings of trees with an understory of smaller trees and shrubs in tree/shrub islands, on edges, or along property borders.

►<u>Nectar & Pollen Plants for</u> J <u>Sun or Part-Sun</u>

Landscaping on a small piece of property? Consider Swamp Milkweed, Blue Wild Indigo, Rough-stemmed Goldenrod, Joe-Pye Weed, and Coral Honeysuckle, which do double duty as butterfly and moth host plants as well as providing excellent sources of nectar and pollen. Perennials and grasses also provide leaves, seeds, and cover for birds and other wildlife.
