After last year's event was cancelled due to the pandemic, we are especially glad to work for its return.

This year's auction will look different from past auctions in several ways. For one thing, the auction will start one week ahead of time and culminate live on Zoom on Saturday, November 13, beginning at 7:00 p.m. Featured that night on Zoom will be the Live Auction, hosted by Heather Brilla and others, and live drawings will be held to determine winners of the small dinners and the many valuable items offered this year in Chance. Everyone has an equal opportunity to win through random drawings. Check the Catalog carefully (both Parts I and II), and pick your favorites.

Fixed Price and Chance items have been on view downstairs at the UU Center on three consecutive Sundays, October 24 & 31 and November 7. The two-part CATALOG of offerings, to be sent out electronically on Friday, November 5, you are now (virtually) holding in your hands. BIDDING begins next day, Saturday, November 6. (A very limited number of print copies of the catalog will be available at the service on Sunday.)

IN ORDER TO BID, on Saturday, November 6, you will receive four (4) forms electronically, by email, and you will use these to bid on auction offerings. You will pick your choices for small dinners, buy fixed price items, and more. You can purchase Chance "virtual tickets" and start spending them on items you like. Winners will be named on auction night, so be sure to attend on Zoom. And be sure you're on hand for the Live Auction that night!

This event has never been possible without the generosity of many. It is definitely a team effort. Thanks to ALL of you who have participated and helped already, and who will manage the auction night Zoom in person at the UU Center. How to Bid: Auction Guidelines

Pre-Auction Week & Auction Night via Zoom

The **16th Annual UUCSJS Auction** opens on Sat., November 6, and culminates via **Zoom** starting 7:00 p.m. on Sat., November 13, 2021. It will unfold as follows: **1**) The CATALOG (in two sections, Parts I & II) will be sent to members & friends electronically on Fri., November 5, and also be available online. **2**) On Sat., November 6, you will receive electronically, by email, four (4) interactive FORMS which you will use to bid on your choices for events, items, and other offerings. **3**) Bidding CLOSES at <u>12 Noon on Sat., November 13</u> (except for Live Auction). **4**) Finally, tune in on auction night, <u>Sat., November 13</u>, beginning at 7:00 p.m. — live on Zoom — for the Live Auction, and much more!

The Auction Steering Committee reserves the right to withdraw any offering at any time without notice before the actual sale. In the event of a dispute, the Auction Steering Committee shall act as final authority in determining the winning bid.

For EVENTS/Small Dinners: You, or you and your partner, will sign up and indicate your 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and 4th choices. If a particular dinner is the first choice of more people than there are slots for, a random drawing will be held on the night of the Zoom auction. Names not drawn will be placed in the drawing for their *second* choice, and so on. This will continue until all small dinners are filled. Any open spaces will be made known and you will be given a way to sign up. (For complete instructions, see Events Form that you will use to bid.)

For EVENTS/Other Events: You may sign up for as many of these events as you wish, with or without a partner. If there are more people signed up for an event than there are spaces, a random drawing will be held. Submitting the form constitutes a legal contract to purchase that event at the price stated. Any open spaces can still be purchased on auction night. (For complete instructions, see Events Form that you will use to bid.)

For LIVE AUCTION: You may bid on any item or service during the pre-auction week, but bids will not be final until Sat., November 13, on auction night. <u>Minimum bids</u> are so stated with the offering. Highest early bid will be used on auction night to open further bidding on Zoom, which will continue until all items are sold. A bid duly acknowledged by the auctioneer is a legal contract to purchase the offering. (If you cannot attend in person on auction night via Zoom, you may make use of the Proxy form found on page 7, below.)

For FIXED PRICE ITEMS: You may buy any item at any time after the auction opens, up to and including auction night, if available. Take note of whether offers are multiple, or one only. To place a bid, mark and submit the Fixed Price Form. Submitting the form constitutes a legal contract to purchase that item at the price stated. (For complete instructions, see Fixed Price Items Form that you will use to bid.)

For CHANCE ITEMS: You may purchase virtual Chance tickets, using the Chance Items Form you receive, as follows: 20 tickets for **\$15**; 40 tickets for **\$20**; and each additional 20 tickets for **\$10**. You may then bid on individual items by indicating how many Chance tickets you wish to bid on any given item. After Chance closes on Sat., November 13 at noon, a random number generator will be used to select the winners. (For complete instructions, see Chance Items Form that you will use to bid.)

Payment

The software being used for auction transactions this year generates a electronic record for each winning bidder. You will receive with an itemized statement from the UUCSJS Treasurer and/or the Bookkeeper, at which time you will be offered payment options. Your quick settlement of these amounts due and payable is expected and appreciated.

Item Pick-Up

If you are the winning bidder on any Live Auction, Fixed Price, or Chance <u>items</u>, please pick these up in a downstairs RE classroom within fourteen (14) days of the auction date. Although some effort will be made to reunite items with the winning bidder, after time expires (and before Thanksgiving), items left unclaimed will need to be removed and donated, unless special arrangements are made.

Winners of <u>services</u> are responsible for contacting the donor in order to arrange for and receive the services offered. Winners of <u>events</u> will be so notified by the Events coordinator, and later contacted by those who are offering the event.

Account Events Cancellations

Event hosts will personally contact participants prior to their event to confirm attendance. If a guest, after signing up and paying, cannot attend an event on the stated date, it is the guest's loss. The host is under no obligation to make up the event for that guest. However, if the host needs to cancel, for any reason (e.g., illness, inclement weather, etc.), the host will reschedule the event. If this is not possible, or it is not possible to reschedule when all guests can attend, those who cannot attend may request a refund from the UUCSJS Treasurer.

If the event does not have a planned date at the time of the auction, and the host cannot find a date that is acceptable to everyone who signed up and paid the cost, the host should hold the event more than once, or in some other way take responsibility to please all guests.

Terms of Sale

Unless otherwise noted, all certificates for goods and services must be used within one (1) year of the auction ate. All items and services are subject to the terms and conditions specified by the donors.

All sales are final. There will be no exchanges or refunds. UUCSJS does not make any expressed or implied warranties or guarantees on auction items regarding quality or value of items or services. UUCSJS has attempted to describe and catalog all items correctly, but all items are offered and sold "AS IS" and "WITH ALL FAULTS."

UUCSJS neither warrants nor represents, and in no event shall be responsible for the correctness of descriptions, genuineness, authorship, provenance or condition of the items. No statement made in this catalog or made orally at the auction or elsewhere shall be deemed such a warranty for tax purposes or market value. Items have not been appraised unless otherwise noted.




