Murray Grove is significant to Unitarian Universalists as the birthplace of Universalism in America. Here, John Murray preached the first Universalist sermon in America after an unexpected, serendipitous meeting with the visionary Thomas Potter, 255 years ago.

Murray Grove is a retreat center that extends a warm welcome to visitors and guests. The location, adjacent to 200 acres of the Edwin B Forsythe wildlife preserve, provides a peaceful, natural setting to focus on connection, community, and renewal. Walk the labyrinth, have a deep conversation, listen to the birds, visit the nearby Potter chapel, or enjoy Smores by the fire pit in the evening.

Auction Guidelines 63

The 20th Annual UUCSJS Auction starts officially at 5:30 PM on Sat., November 15, 2025, with doors opening for previews at 5:00. The Auction Committee reserves the right to withdraw any offering at any time without notice before the actual sale. Last minute events, services, or items may also be added to the auction offerings at any time up to and including auction night itself. In the event of any dispute, the Auction Committee shall act as final authority in determining the winning bid.

For the LIVE AUCTION: You may bid on any live auction item or service during the Live Auction on the evening of the auction at the UU Center. Minimum or opening bids are usually noted with the offer and can be modified by the auctioneer at any time during the proceedings. Bidding continues until all items or services are sold (or the auctioneer closes the bidding on the item or service). Note that a bid duly acknowledged by the auctioneer is a legal contract to purchase the offering. (If you cannot attend in person, you may make use of the Proxy form found in this catalog.)

For the EVENTS: You — or you and your partner — may sign up for one small dinner or other similar event during the first round of open bidding. This constraint is meant to give everyone present the chance to obtain a small dinner or similar event of their choice. After that first round is complete, you may sign up for any space which is open for any event up to the time bidding on Events officially closes. Winners will get an event sticker for their tally sheet if they win a spot at any event.

Any unsold auction events will be available for sign up and payment on the Sunday following the auction, and may then be offered later by special announcement and/or through Breeze, our church software program. Instructions for using Breeze will be forthcoming, if applicable.

For the SERVICES, HANDMADE ITEMS, and OTHER ITEMS: You may bid on any service or item at any time after the auction opens at 5:30 p.m. on auction night. Minimum or opening bids are so stated with the offering. Take note of multiple offers, if any, or whether the service or item is one-of-a-kind. Also, please note that table monitors may modify opening bids up or down at their discretion as the auction proceeds (except for Fixed Price items). Bidding continues until all bidding on Services, Handmade Items, or Other Items officially closes, at which time the highest bid wins. You will get a sticker from the table monitor to put on your tally sheet if you win. Signing the bid form constitutes a legal contract to purchase the service or item at that price.

For the CHANCE ITEMS: You can purchase Chance tickets at the ticket table as you enter the auction on auction night, as follows: 20 tickets for \$20 and 40 tickets for \$30. (Each additional tranche of 20 is just \$15.) You bid on individual items by placing tickets in the container bearing the number of the item on which you want to bid. After time is officially called on Chance Items, a random drawing will be held to select the winners.

Auction Guidelines (continued)

Payment

At the end of the evening you will present your **20th Annual Auction Night Tally Sheet** at the checkout table where you will settle your account and obtain a receipt. Your timely settlement of this amount due is expected and will be appreciated.

Item Pickups

If you are the winning bidder on any <u>Live Auction</u>, <u>Chance</u>, or any other <u>Item</u>, please take the item away with you on auction night. If this is not feasible, the item may be picked up from a downstairs RE classroom within the next fourteen (14) days. Although effort will be made to reunite items with the winning bidder, after time expires (and before Thanksgiving), items left behind may be removed and donated, unless special arrangements are made.

Winners of <u>Services</u> are responsible for contacting the donor, and vice versa, in order to arrange for and receive the services offered. Winners of <u>Events</u> will be so notified by the Events coordinator, and then later contacted by those who are offering the event.

Auction Events Cancellations

Event hosts will personally contact participants prior to their event to confirm attendance. If a guest, after signing up and paying, cannot attend an event on the stated date, it is the guest's loss. The host is under no obligation to make up the event for that guest.

If the host needs to cancel, for any reason (e.g., illness, inclement weather, etc.), the host will reschedule the event. If this is not possible, or not possible to reschedule when all guests can attend, those who cannot attend may request a refund from the UUCSJS Treasurer.

If the event does not have a planned date at the time of the auction, and the host cannot find a date that is acceptable to everyone who signed up and paid, the host should hold the event more than once, or in some way take responsibility to please all guests.

Terms of Sale

Unless otherwise noted, all certificates for goods and services must be used within one (1) year of the auction date unless otherwise stated. All items and services are subject to the terms and conditions specified by the donors.

All sales are final. There will be no exchanges or refunds. UUCSJS does not make any expressed or implied warranties or guarantees on auction items regarding quality or value of items or services. UUCSJS has attempted to describe and catalog all items correctly, but all items are offered and sold "AS IS" and "WITH ALL FAULTS."

UUCSJS neither warrants nor represents, and in no event shall be responsible for the correctness of descriptions, genuineness, authorship, provenance or condition of the items. No statement made in this catalog or made orally at the auction or elsewhere shall be deemed such a warranty for tax purposes or market value. Items have not been appraised unless otherwise noted.






